A Word from Bob Burtscher, TOF – Acting Minister

Since we have been unable to meet due to the restrictions of the COVID-19 pandemic and quarantine, I am writing to you as Minister to let you know about plans we have for our fraternity.

Currently, only Roberto Meza, TOF, and I are Council members - Roberto as your Vice-Minister, and I as your Minister. Pepe Ventosa, TOF is assisting us, and Debbie Ventosa, TOF continues as Formation Director. We are carrying on in order to move forward to have a full Council. We are working on our website and fraternity statutes. We would like to get organized with our apostolates and plan for activities, such as our picnic and maybe a hike at the park in early Fall. It will be beneficial to have a Council for more representation of the membership of the fraternity.

It seems best to have a Council appointed by Fr. Vit. This Council will function only temporarily as we get more organized. Hopefully in a year or so, maybe after those in Formation are professed, we can vote for a Council that will serve our community for three years. This is in full accord with our Constitutions. Per Article 122:

"At the establishment of a new fraternity, according to the Ceremonial of the Order, the Council is appointed by the one who establishes the fraternity, after consultation with the director already appointed. In other cases, the Council shall be elected at a general meeting by the professed tertiaries, who have not been deprived of the right to vote."

We need volunteers who are willing to serve in this temporary council. If you feel called, please contact me. We have gotten in touch with some members to see if they wish to serve. If you would like to nominate someone, let me know and we will contact him/her. *Important: We need to year from you by Monday, May 11.* We will proceed as follows:

- 1. May 12: We will have a list of members willing to serve in the Council.
- 2. May 13-15: Roberto and I will assist Fr. Vit as he discerns whom to appoint. Please keep us in your prayers.
- 3. May 15: Fr. Vit will decide whom to appoint for the different Council positions.
- 4. May 17: Fr. Vit will appoint the Council. Since the restrictions from the COVID-19 remain and we cannot gather in May, you will hear through the newsletter who has been appointed as new members of Council.
- 5. In late May, Council will have its first Council meeting.



His favorite quote is from St. Francis of Assisi: "Holy humility confounds pride and all the men of this world and all the things that are in the world."

Matthew studied at St. Andrew University in Laurinburg, North Carolina, on a Bagpiping Scholarship. He met his future wife, Jess, there when she was involved with the Equestrian Program. Sadly, his religious education had stopped after First Communion. While at the university he wanted to continue in the Catholic faith. Fr. Saxon, of St. Mary Catholic Church in the area helped him study and he received the Sacrament of Confirmation. He takes his Catholic Faith very seriously.

He is a member of Little Flower Parish, Canton, and is an active member of the Knights of Columbus and the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre. He is looking forward to assisting with the Rite of Christian Initiation and the Adult Education programs. His wife, Jess, was in RCIA until the pandemic put that on hold.

St. Padre Pio has a special place in his life. While he was studying in India, he prayed the rosary, and he had an image of this wonderful Franciscan saint. For instance, the Cleveland Diocese airs Sunday Mass at 6 AM on Fox 8 television, as well as on their website, where you can access daily Mass from St. John Cathedral. If your parish has a website, check for messages from your pastor and information on Masses which may be broadcast from your parish. EWTN is an excellent source to view daily and Sunday Mass, as well as the Rosary, Divine Mercy chaplet, and other quality Catholic programming.
