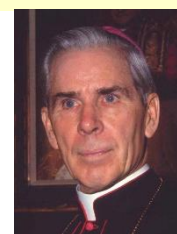

Novice Pre-Profession Retreat



On March 13, 2021, our novices will attend a “Pre-Profession Retreat”. The theme for the retreat will be “Franciscan Tertiaries: *Longing for Perfection While Living in the World*” and will be held at the Shrine of Our Lady Comforter of the Afflicted in Youngstown. On January 18, 2021, the SS. Francis and Clare Fraternity hosted a “Come and See” at the home of Debbie Ventosa, TOF, Formation Director. The event was well-attended, with 13 guests who came to hear an introduction to the Third Order of St. Francis. There were also 7 members of the Fraternity, as well as Fr. Vit, who provided invaluable information about the Third Order. Ten of those present are currently attending Initial formation as they discern if they are being called to the Third Order. They are learning a brief overview of Franciscan history, signs, symbols, a brief biography of St. Francis and St. Clare, and learning to pray Lectio Divina.

Welcoming New Isolated Tertiaries into the Franciscan Tertiaries of the OFM Province of the Immaculate Conception

On February 11, 2021, the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM established two new isolated Tertiaries into our community of Franciscan Tertiaries. They are Ericka Witover, TOF from Texas, and Linda Menser, TOF from California. They join the first isolated tertiary who came to us, Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF of Olympia, Washington.

Ericka Witover, TOF was professed into the OFS in April, 1999 in the St. Anthony Fraternity of Manchester, New Hampshire, and discerned to transfer into our community of tertiaries. She has been married to her husband, Eric, for over 20 years this October. Ericka has a servant's heart, as you will find her assisting her husband with the care he requires. Together, they care for their two dogs, Blue and Tony.

A move to Texas in 2004 enabled her to continue sharing her gift of teaching as she served her OFS fraternities, first in New Hampshire and then in Dallas, Texas as their Formation Director. We have had Ericka join our Formation meetings via Facetime, and her input has been a blessing to those present.



Ericka is also gifted with creative writing skills. She is the author of a Catholic science fiction book that she looks toward publishing next year. Ericka has also authored two children's books to be ready for publication once the illustrator completes his portion. She has studied the Rule and Constitution and shared that becoming associated with the TOF will help her become more diligent and devoted to a prayer life with the Rule that outlines just how to do that.

Linda Menser, TOF was professed into the OFS in May, 2019, and also discerned to transfer into our community. She has three sons and three young grandchildren, with one on the way. Linda, an energetic Army veteran and retired postal carrier, resides in California. Her sons are also veterans, two serving in law enforcement and one at the Veteran's Administration. Linda is privileged to care for her 90-year-old father, a Navy veteran, and lovingly assists her grandchildren as needed.

A pilgrim at heart, Linda visited Israel, Rome, and Assisi. In 2018, she also visited the USS Arizona in Pearl Harbor, as well as a memorable March for Life in Washington, DC, where President Trump addressed the Right to Life participants historically in person.

Linda enthusiastically describes her Franciscan mission as one of caring for her family, and defending the unborn who cannot speak for themselves. Eucharistic Adoration is central to her spirituality, and she signed up for Tuesdays and Fridays on the Eucharistic Adoration schedule of the SS. Francis and Clare Fraternity. Twice weekly, Linda is outside the local Planned Parenthood to peacefully pray and educate the abortion-minded with alternatives and resources.

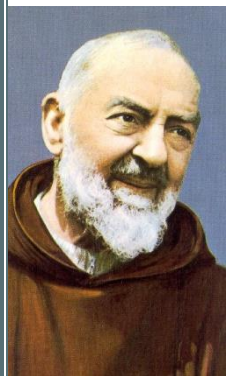

The Apostolate of the St. Padre Pio Fraternity ***by Dr. Pat Cuttica, TOF – Minister***

There are actually two apostolates which identify the newly-founded Third Order Franciscan Fraternity of St. Padre Pio. These are service to the Shrine of Our Lady Comforter of the Afflicted, and prayer.



Though our present fraternity has existed at the Shrine of Our Lady Comforter of the Afflicted for just over one year, the history of the Third Order of St. Francis at the shrine dates back to the mid-twentieth century. Over the years, these followers of St. Francis, in addition to their love of our seraphic father, have had one thing in common – their care of, and dedication to, the Shrine and its friars. From decorating and cleaning of the church, to helping with the care of the retreat house, planting summer flowers, and more, our Franciscans brothers and sisters are always ready to be of service to the Shrine. This readiness for service has evolved into a beautiful apostolate of our fraternity.

The second apostolate which marks our fraternity is that of prayer. Though prayer is a long-standing commitment of all Franciscans, our fraternity is embarking on a new commitment to prayer. The object of this prayer will change monthly as the need arises, and each member will discern the manner in which he or she will pray. This commitment will be above and beyond our members' usual prayer life.

Though members of our fraternity are involved with their own specific spiritual and corporal works of mercy, these identifying apostolates of the St. Padre Pio Fraternity will continue to define our fraternity as a whole as we walk together in the footsteps of St. Francis with Christ as the center of our lives.
