In Catholic tradition, the month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We are reminded of the unfailing mercy of Jesus to those who follow Him and do their best to follow His example and His guidance will sustain us in times of confusion, pain, and distraction from worldly vices. And that Jesus will never abandon those who honor His Sacred Heart.


St. John Chrysostom had this to say about the devotion to the Sacred Heart: "Beloved, do not pass over this mystery without thought: it has yet another hidden meaning, which I will explain to you. I said that water and blood symbolized Baptism and the Holy Eucharist. From these two Sacraments the Church is born: from Baptism, the cleansing water that gives rebirth and renewal through the Holy Spirit, and from the Holy Eucharist. Since the symbols of Baptism and the Eucharist flowed from His side, it was from His side that Christ fashioned the Church, as he had fashioned Eve from the side of Adam...As God took a rib from Adam's side to fashion a woman, so Christ has given us blood and water from His side to fashion the Church. God took the rib when Adam was in a deep sleep, and in the same way, Christ gave us the blood and water after His own death."

When we invite Jesus to live in our own hearts, He guides our lives in His Way. We find the inspiration to die to self and to truly love others by His example of agape, which is God's perfect and unconditional love.





Ohio House Bill 248 Information

Currently in the State of Ohio, an important piece of legislation is being discussed, House Bill 248. The Bill is to enact Section 3792.02 of the Revised Code to authorize an individual to decline a vaccination and to name this act the Vaccine Choice and Anti-Discrimination Act.

Please familiarize yourself with this Bill and the importance of protecting an individual's right to conscientious objection. Notify your Ohio House Representative is so prompted.

Exercise of Religion for June

Article 68: Every year in the month of January or of June, each fraternity will publicly make or renew its solemn Consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and in the month of May or December its Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary using the approved prayers. With it being the month of June, our June Exercise of Religion will be to participate in the Consecration at the Profession on June 5. If you are unable to attend the Profession, please privately pray the Consecration.

Lord, It Is Good for Us to Be Together!

We met for our gathering on Sunday, May 16 at St. Nicholas Byzantine Church, with 30 members present, including Fr. Vit, Annie Butts and Fred Kramer, several Inquirers, and several members who were with us virtually. These included Larry and Lucy McNutt, TOF; and Ericka Witover, TOF.

We began with the opening ritual prayer, and then Liturgy of the Hours. And then, on to Lectio Divina, which was the Gospel of the day, which was on the Feast of the Ascension. We shared what spoke to us from the readings with our partners, and then prayed together.

Ongoing Formation was led by Rick Dunlap, TOF, who spoke on Section 1, Article 5 of the Constitution of the Franciscan Third Order – "Therefore, the Tertiaries, instructed and trained in the Gospel life, which is truly apostolic, should imitate in their own daily lives their Seraphic Father, who did not think himself of Christ if he did not devote himself to the souls redeemed by him."

Rick explained that our goal as Tertiaries is to strive for Christian perfection. Although we are imperfect, we all have a desire for perfection within our own individual stations in life. Our ultimate goal is to perfectly conform our lives to the Gospel.

St. Francis became totally involved physically, mentally, emotionally and spiritually in the Word. The Gospel helped Francis move closer in love to Christ. We Franciscans do not presume to know the Gospel completely, nor do we implement it with perfection – but we keep trying,

If we only read the Gospel and never apply it, we become hypocrites with big words and small actions, simply going through the motions. Our Rule of fraternity life is to nudge us to go from Gospel to life and life to Gospel. Being trained in the Gospel, we continue to grow in our knowledge and most importantly, the implementation day



knowledge, and most importantly, the implementation, day after day.

To be apostolic means putting our Faith into practice daily, which can be done in many ways, including participation in our own fraternity apostolates of feeding the poor, praying at abortion clinics, participating in prison ministry, and spending time in Adoration and Confession. It also means beginning our day with prayer, Mass, and offering ourselves to God, for Him to use us to further His Kingdom, and to do it willingly.

Rick prepared questions for our group discussions during our snack break, which we discussed afterward.

Roberto Meza, TOF, who is our Acting Minister, kept us up to date with a variety of information:

- 1. Roberto reminded us he is accepting donations of rosaries for Deacon Gastor Bahati, the seminarian we have been sponsoring in the Diocese of Moshi, Tanzania. It is customary for African priests to offer rosaries to their parishioners during their visitations. Deacon Gastor, with the grace of God, will be ordained in August. At this point, we have collected 880 rosaries. Special thanks to Jennifer Kerns, TOF for making many beautiful rosaries, some in the national colors of Tanzania. Ms. T. O. Bennett will be attending the Ordination and will deliver our gift to him.
- 2. Mike Butts, TOF generously donated his late father's crucifix for Deacon Gastor's Ordination, which Fr. Vit blessed.
- 3. A baby shower for Matt and Jessica Poletti took place during our lunch break. They are expecting a daughter, Caroline, who has a July 4 due date.
- 4. There will be no Little Portion for June, since we will meet in Youngstown for the Profession and Investiture. Jim and Nettie Miller will prepare the Little Portion in July, with Chris Devore, TOF delivering it.
- 5. Rose Akins, TOF and Matt Poletti will represent the fraternity for the Stand for Life in June. Bill Marshall, TOF will represent in July. A replacement is needed for Debbie Ventosa, TOF, who will be unable to pair with Bill in July due to upcoming surgery. Please contact Debbie if you can help.
- 6. Bill Marshall, TOF is scheduled to lead us in Ongoing Formation in July.

After the break, Fr. Vit discussed Apostolic Life for the Tertiary. Just as in current times, in the days of the Apostles, there were many political movements. After the Apostles witnessed the Resurrection, the Faith spread. Different ideologies developed alongside Christianity.

Father explained the different loves. Eros is the love of human desire. Agape, which is unselfish love, is spoken of in Scripture and describes God. God's love for us is agape. God comes as a beggar, Who

comes to our hearts and asks us to love Him. God is powerless in His relationship with us. He cannot make us love Him. He wants to freely love Him.

Maria Elena Meza, TOF delivered the Infirmarian Report. She asks that we pray for our shut-ins and excused, including Pat and Deanna Hurley, OFS, Sandy Pollino, OFS, Bob Burtscher, TOF, Betty DeMarco, TOF, Dorothy Takacs, OFS, and Elizabeth Francis, TOF. Maria Elena reported that there were seven Franciscans who held wake services for Betty Smith.

Roberto recognized Mary Dye for functioning as Council Helper during this very busy and evolving time in our fraternity. Mary has been doing a lot of work behind the scenes, helping to prepare for Profession Day (which will include her!) and being of help in various ways for Council. We are very grateful for her hard work!

Leslie Ann Magda delivered the food pantry collection to SS. Cosmas and Damian Parish in Twinsburg.



THE 12 PROMISES

of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque

Our Lord Jesus Christ appeared to St. Margaret Mary_between 1673-1675. Among the words spoken to her, she heard Jesus make 12 promises to those who would respond to the pleading of His Heart and make an effort to return His love.

St. Margaret Mary once said, "I do not know of any other exercise in the spiritual life that is more calculated to raise a soul in a short amount of time to the height of perfection and to make it taste the true sweetness to be found in the service of Jesus Christ."

- **1-.** I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- 2. I will establish peace in their homes.
- 3. I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
- **4.** I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
- **5.** I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- **6.** Sinners will find in My Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7. Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- **8.** Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- **9.** I will bless every place in which an image of My Heart is exposed and honored.
- **10.** I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- **11.** Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart.
- **12.** I promise you in the excessive mercy of My Heart that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in My disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.
