Deacon Gastor will receive Holy Orders on August 12. God heard our prayers! Deacon (soon to be Father!) Gastor promises to remember us and to pray for us. May God bless his ministry abundantly, and bless and protect him in his holy vocation!

If you are unable to fulfill your commitment, find a substitute. *NEVER* go alone to the clinic – pray from home if your partner will be absent and you cannot find a substitute.



August Exercise Challenge

Article 40 of the Constitutions reads, "Tertiaries shall meditate on and put into practice before all else that well-known two-fold commandment of Christ: 'Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart and thy whole soul and thy whole mind.' This is the greatest of the commandments, and the first. And the second, like it, is this, 'Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself'."

In his encyclical Sacra Propediem, Pope Benedict XV writes that St. Francis was "powerless to contain in the recesses of his heart the seraphic love which consumed him for God and his brothers; he was compelled to permit it to overflow on all the souls which he could reach."

Last month we focused on the first part of the two-fold commandment of Christ, to love God with our whole heart, soul and mind. Would you take the August Exercise of Religion Challenge and work this month on the 2nd part of this commandment, to love your neighbor as yourself?

Food assignments are as follows, by last name initial:


A-L - Salads/Sides

Lord, It Is Good for Us to Be Together!

The Gathering of July 18 included 29 in attendance. We were delighted to see Betty DeMarco, TOF, Bob Burtscher, TOF, and Elizabeth Francis, TOF, in addition to Affiliates Annie Butts and Fred Kramer.

The Liturgy of the Hours was led by Kenny Green, TOF and Bill Marshall, TOF.

We then progressed to Lectio Divina, which was focused on St. Mark's Gospel of the day.

Bill Marshall, TOF led us in Ongoing Formation. His subject was Article Eleven, Section 2 of the Constitution. Bill opened with the Prayer to the Holy Spirit. He then discussed the Article, which details eligibility and expectations of those enrolled in the Order, and the definition of the Third Order and Tertiaries.

- 1. It is more important that the Order grow in holiness than in numbers. Not everyone is qualified for this way of life.
- 2. Disqualifications include: being younger than 14 years of age, etc.
- 3. We must pray for growth and holiness in the Church, and hold ourselves to God's law and service. We are His servants and follow His Will. It is not about us.
- 4. Every human deserves dignity and respect.
- 5. We are part of, and stewards of, all Creation.
- 6. A good Franciscan equals a good Catholic!

Our group discussion and social break followed, along with a review of our discussion of the Ongoing Formation.

Roberto reminded us of the fraternity picnic in August, as well as the kind and hospitable invitation to the St. Padre Pio Fraternity's picnic in Youngstown. Please check for your food assignment (see picnic article in this newsletter).

Fr. Vit then talked to us about holiness and Good Shepherd Sunday. The way to be holy is first to want it for ourselves. In order to survive, we must eat, drink, breathe, work, pray, and enjoy recreation. Sin comes to us in images and thoughts, whether we welcome it or not. Thoughts become sin when we act on them. Temptation is not sin until we act on it. There is no salvation without temptation. We are connected to God by Faith even without evidence of His presence. We must design a spiritual path to attain holiness, and constantly remember

God and focus on Him. If we pray about our past, our present will be peaceful. Avoid idle time – plan your activities and do not permit occasions of sin (i.e., inappropriate Internet websites, etc.) Remembrance evokes emotions, so pray to be able to forgive those who hurt us.

The Food Pantry collection for July went to our host parish, St. Nicholas Byzantine Church. Joanne Angeletti and Virgil and Louise Daniel ensured it will be delivered.

The July Little Portion was provided by the Millers and delivered by the Devores, and Annie Butts will prepare the August Little Portion, which will include items from our picnic meal. We are still in need of someone to deliver the August offering.

Mike Butts, TOF and Bill Marshall, TOF represented the fraternity for the July Stand for Life, and Rose Akins, TOF and Gib Adolph will represent us for August.

Maria Elena Meza, TOF gave the Infirmarian Report. Bob Burtscher, TOF has been unable to contact Pat and Deanna Hurley, OFS. Judith Hoyt, TOF reported that Sandy Pollino, OFS's situation is unchanged and she is in urgent need of prayer. (We learned later in the month that Sandy's mother, Angie, died).

Debbie Ventosa, TOF reported that those in Initial Formation are reviewing the <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u>. We are blessed to have six individuals in Formation at this point.

Pepe Ventosa, TOF informed us that the Isolated Tertiaries are growing in number. We currently have members from California, Florida, Texas, and Washington, and an Australian has expressed interest as well. Ericka Witover, TOF and Fr. Dennis Arambasick, OFM continue to lead Initial Formation of the Isolated Tertiaries. They are in the process of updating a curriculum for Initial Formation.

Roberto Meza, TOF was delighted to report that Bishop Bonnar of Youngstown has given his approval of the Third Order Franciscans in his Diocese! The approval was a bit delayed because of the death of Bishop Murry, SJ and the time waiting for his replacement. We had previously received official approval from Bishop Malesic of Cleveland, as well as his support and ongoing prayers. We are indeed blessed!

Roberto also reminded us to sign up for our fraternity apostolates. Please contact him if you feel called to service in a particular area.

Check the Padre Pio Prayer Group website if you are interested in being part of their pilgrimage.

Roberto informed us that there are openings for our fraternity members to staff the Stark County Right to Life table at the Stark County Fair on Labor Day weekend. We need to fill three 4-hour shifts and need volunteers for the 10 AM-2 PM and the 6 PM-10 PM shifts. Please contact Roberto if you are able to assist.

We are reminded, if we wish to distribute anything at Gatherings, Formation meetings, or on any other fraternity occasion, to get clearance first from our Minister!
