



Eucharistic Adoration and Daily Prayer

Council asks those of us who participate in Eucharistic Adoration – and the rest of our fraternity - to remember the following intentions every day when you pray:

1. The spiritual protection of our fraternity and of all our members.

- 2. Those in our fraternity who are sick, and their families.
- 3. **Pope Francis** and his intentions.
- 4. Our bishops: **Bishop David Bonnar** of the Diocese of Youngstown, **Bishop Milan Lach, SJ** of the Eparchy of Parma, and **Bishop Edward Malesic, JCL** of the Diocese of Cleveland.
- 5. The Friars of the Immaculate Conception Province of the OFM, particularly **Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM**, **Fr. Dennis Arambasick, OFM**, and **Fr. Robert Campagna, OFM**, who is the Provincial Minister.
- 6. Our beloved pastors and parish priests, and our parishes, including **Fr. Miron Kerul-Kmec**, who hosts our fraternity every month. We also pray for **Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF**, an Isolated Tertiary who is the pastor of St. George Byzantine Parish in Olympia, Washington, as well as a professor at SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary.
- 7. **Fr. Gastor Temu Bahati**, a priest of the Diocese of Moshi, whom we have spiritually supported for several years.
- 8. **Frater Francis Tumaini** of the Diocese of Moshi, who is the seminarian we have adopted.
- 9. All the seminarians of St. Mary Seminary and Borromeo Seminary in Cleveland, which serves the Youngstown and Cleveland Dioceses, as well as the seminarians of SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary, which serves the Eparchy of Parma. Our fraternity has spiritually adopted a seminarian from Stark County (Arthur Bodenschatz, Christ the Servant Parish in Canton), from Summit County (Joseph Rohan, St. Joseph Parish in Cuyahoga Falls), and from Capuchin Formation (Christopher Klobuchir).



That's a lot! But it is part of our holy Franciscan vocation to prayerfully support our fellow Franciscans, the Pope, our bishops, our priests, and seminarians. We have no Order without faithful Franciscans, no priests without our seminarians, no Eucharist without our priests, and no Church without the Eucharist. All these individuals on the list sacrifice daily for us, and the very least we can do is to pray for them!

We met for the February 20 Gathering at St. Nicholas Byzantine Parish. We had 33 in attendance and were blessed to welcome several visitors: Jess and little Caroline Poletti (7 months old already!), John Gough, Linda Horst, Fred Kramer, Annie Butts, Father Vit, and Brother Max (Joanne Angeletti's Yorkie).

We prayed the Daytime Prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours, led by Kenny Green, TOF, Bill Marshall, TOF, and Debbie Ventosa, TOF.

Debbie Ventosa, TOF led us in Lectio Divina. Debbie read the Gospel of the day from St. Luke ("love your enemies and do good to them" and "be merciful"). As always, we paired up and discussed how God spoke to us in this reading and prayed together.

A delicious luncheon meal was prepared by Bill Marshall, TOF, Nettie Miller, TOF, and Debbie Ventosa, TOF, including chili, cobb salad, vegetable soup, and various other tasty snacks.

Joanne Angeletti, TOF, who regularly volunteers with Embrace, talked to us and spoke about the mothers, fathers and families in need and at-risk pregnant women. Embrace offers counselling, educates about faithful alternatives to abortion, and offers parenting lessons and support for fathers in addition to support for those in dire need. Our members donated items for use in this ministry, including diapers, infant to toddler clothing, food and baby formula, baby wipes, ointments and creams, and money, which Embrace will put to good use.

Maria Elena Meza, TOF then offered the Infirmarian Report. Judith Hoyt, TOF has been in contact with Sandy Pollino, OFS. Sandy is recovering and making progress with her health challenges. Her daughter, Dr. Noelle, is nearly ready to deliver her second child. Judith also spoke to Dorothy Takacs, OFS, who remains cheerful. Both are in need of our prayers. Bob Burtscher, TOF spoke to Elizabeth Francis, TOF, who says her brother is staying with her. She is upbeat, and is volunteering at Robinson Memorial Hospital and attending Mass at her parish. Bob has not heard from Pat and Deanna Hurley, OFS.

Debbie Ventosa, TOF was next with the Formation Report. Our two local Formation students, Jesse Kuhn and Denise Williams, meet for regular meetings twice monthly. They are studying the Catechism of the Third Order Franciscans_and the Admonitions of St. Francis. At this point, they are halfway through Formation! Rose Akins, TOF is assisting with Formation, and Debbie very much appreciates Rose's steady and dependable efforts. All fraternity members are welcome to attend Formation.

In news from the Isolated Tertiaries, Pepe Ventosa, TOF reports Tertiaries from California, Washingon State, Texas, Florida, and Australia! The steady growth of our Isolated Tertiaries is surely the work of the Holy Spirit and our good St. Francis, and it is very encouraging to us all. After all, St. Francis started with only a few loyal brothers in a small village in Italy, and in a few years the Franciscans spread all over Italy, then Europe, and eventually worldwide!

Roberto Meza, TOF and Pepe Ventosa, TOF stressed to our membership the need to update our email groups on a regular basis. Emails intended for our membership should be for our fraternity

membership and not for friends who are not members of our fraternity.

Roberto then gave us information about our upcoming community pilgrimage, which will take place on May 21. Along with the members of Our Lady of America fraternity and St. Padre Pio fraternity, we will visit at the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Windsor, Ohio, which is in Ashtabula County. Together with our Third Order Franciscan brothers and sisters, we will pray the Rosary on the Shrine grounds, and attend Mass in the Shrine Chapel, which Roberto has reserved for Mass. Fr. Ryan Furlong, TOF from St. Padre Pio fraternity will be attending and will offer the Mass. See the flyer included in the newsletter for updated information.

There will be a funeral for our late brother, Richard Russelo, TOF who died during the COVID pandemic. The border was closed to Richard's Canadian family until recently, and Richard's wife, Judy, decided to delay the funeral until they could attend. Please let Council know if you plan to attend by the March Gathering. If it is feasible, we may arrange to carpool to Steubenville for the funeral.

Sixty New Testaments in English were purchased from St. Raphael Bookstore with the assistance of Betty DeMarco, TOF. Pepe Ventosa, TOF will deliver them to an Ohio Corrections facility. The New Testaments are pocket-sized so the prisoners can carry them in their uniforms.

Father Vit then offered us Ongoing Formation. Jesus established His authority over the Prophets (Moses, Abraham, etc.) He did this for the benefit of the Jews, who followed the Torah. Jesus was accepted as a teacher and rabbi. He proved Himself as a teacher and rabbi in the story of the adulteress. The Jews waited to catch her in the act in order to see how He reacted, and if He followed the Judaic Law.

The ritual of the Mass echoes and reenacts the Last Supper. Other rituals of the Church come to us from Jesus's time and are celebrated to this day.

The Torah was written for a nation, while Jesus's teaching was meant for the individual. Never lose sight of God even in the midst of evil. The teaching of Jesus is about self-sacrifice, trust, and faith.

Father said we must *NEVER* name our Guardian Angel. It has become common for individuals to try to discern the name of their Guardian Angel. Our Guardian Angel is not for us to name, it is for God to do so. We must only refer to our Guardian Angel as simply "Guardian Angel".

The pillars of spiritual strength and growth are: 1) the faithful and frequent reception of the Sacraments; 2) prayer; 3) practicing the virtues; and 4) meritorious work for the glory and love of God while in a State of Grace.

Roberto announced our certificate of canonical establishment will be displayed on our website. We thank God for this honor and blessing.

We concluded our Gathering by praying for all those we have promised to pray for, including the Pope, our bishops and beloved parish priests, the friars of the Immaculate Conception Province of the OFM, Fr. Robert Campagna, OFM, Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM, Fr. Dennis Arambasick, OFM, Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF, Fr. Miron Kerul-Kmec, Fr. Gastor Bahati, all the seminarians of the Cleveland and Youngstown

Dioceses and of the Eparchy of Parma, and of the Diocese of Moshi, and the seminarians we have spiritually adopted – Frater Francis Tumaini, Arthur Bodenschatz of the Youngstown Diocese, and Joseph Rohan of the Cleveland Diocese. We also prayed for our members and our families, our country and its leadership, and all our personal intentions.
