Something to Consider


July brings us two Franciscan feasts of note, the Feast of St. Bonaventure on July 15, and the Feast of the Canonization of St. Francis on July 16.

Per our Tertiary Statutes (Article 3.9), "Fraternities should observe together when possible the important Franciscan Feasts throughout the year". These two Feasts are part of that list

St. Bonaventure was a Franciscan priest, bishop, cardinal, scholastic theologian, and philosopher. He was the seventh Minister General of the OFM, and the Bishop of Albano (Italy). He tirelessly served the Church and the Order. He was canonized in 1482 and declared a Doctor of the Church in 1588. He is popularly known as the "Seraphic Doctor".

Our good St. Francis, by virtue of the extraordinarily holy life he led and the sacrifices he made for God and the Church, was canonized in July 1228, less than 2 years after his death on October 3, 1226.

This in itself is a startling testament to the universal and undeniable knowledge of the sanctity and witness with which St. Francis lived his life. It is not unusual – indeed, it





fulfilling one's duties, and in patiently bearing adversities. A penance imposed on most Tertiaries by Providence is the daily grind of work. In this they should not see an annoying burden but a protection against the enemies of salvation, and a means to atone for their sins and to gain merits for life everlasting."

Note: The trail is 1.8 miles long with some steep areas. We will only hike a shorter and easier section of the trail. There are a some areas with tree roots exposed and steps. It is considered an "easy" hike.

Directions: take 8 north. Take exit #10 and make a left on Seasons Rd. Go ¾ of a mile and turn right Wyoga Lake Rd and then a quick right on State Rd (Akron Cleveland Rd). At the next light make a left on Kendall Park Rd (1.2 miles). Entrance to the Ledges is about 1 mile on the right side.



- 5. The Friars of the Immaculate Conception Province of the OFM, particularly **Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM**, **Fr. Dennis Arambasick, OFM**, and **Fr. Robert Campagna, OFM**, who is the Provincial Minister.
- 6. Our beloved pastors and parish priests, and our parishes, including **Fr. Miron Kerul-Kmec**, who hosts our fraternity every month. We also pray for **Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF**, an Isolated Tertiary who is the pastor of

St. George Byzantine Parish in Olympia, Washington, as well as a professor at SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary. And **Fr. Ryan Furlong, TOF** of the Padre Pio Fraternity.

- 7. **Fr. Gastor Temu Bahati**, a priest of the Diocese of Moshi, whom we have spiritually supported for several years.
- 8. **Frater Francis Tumaini** of the Diocese of Moshi, who is the seminarian we have adopted.
- 9. All the seminarians of St. Mary Seminary and Borromeo Seminary in Cleveland, which serves the Youngstown and Cleveland Dioceses, as well as the seminarians of SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary, which serves the Eparchy of Parma. Our fraternity has spiritually adopted a seminarian from Stark County (Arthur Bodenschatz, Christ the Servant Parish in Canton), from Summit County (Joseph Rohan, St. Joseph Parish in Cuyahoga Falls), and from Capuchin Formation (Christopher Klobuchir).
- 10. Our beloved and hard-working parish priests.
- 11. Finally, you may want to add prayers for the safety and protection of our Ukrainian brothers and sisters, and for the conversion of Russia as Pope Francis has done in his Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on March 25.

That's a lot! But it is part of our holy Franciscan vocation to prayerfully support our fellow Franciscans, the Pope, our bishops, our priests, and seminarians and anyone in distress and danger. We have no Order without faithful Franciscans, no priests without our seminarians, no Eucharist without our priests, and no Church without the Eucharist. All these individuals on the list sacrifice daily for us, and the very least we can do is to pray for them!


Lord, It Is Good for Us to Be Together!

Virgil Daniel, TOF taught Ongoing Formation on Article 44: "Led by the Spirit of Submission, and with hearts full of joyous gratitude, tertiaries shall regard as outstanding gifts of God the benefits of the Creation, of the Incarnation, and of Redemption. But they shall use the goods of this world in fear of the Lord and put themselves under the yoke of service and of loyalty to God by controlling the gratification of corrupt nature, the gratification of the eye, and the empty pomp of living. They shall always bear in mind that, through Baptism and Holy Profession, they have died with Christ,

and must lead a new kind of life, living for God in Christ Jesus our Lord."



- Articles 39-44 are an introduction and summary of Christian perfection according to the Franciscan spirit.
- "Led by the Spirit of Submission" = humility.
- "Hearts full of joyous gratitude" is the image we present to others as servants of God.
- 4. "They shall use the goods of this world in fear of the Lord": Wisdom, reverence, using goods according to Gods Will, not ours. Responsible use of the world's goods. Avoid wastefulness in accord with God's values. Be a good example to others. Live with simplicity.
- 5. "Put themselves under the yoke of service and loyalty to God": This is mentioned in the Admonitions and the Profession ceremony. Keep the Commandments. Don't be politically correct – be loyal to God. Pray devotedly. Be loyal to the teaching of the Church. "God is 1st, others are 2nd, and I am 3rd."
- 6. "They shall always bear in mind that, through Baptism and Holy Profession, they have died with Christ and must lead a new kind of life, living for God in Christ Jesus our Lord.": God has expectations of us as when we die with Christ and embrace our holy profession. Be in the world, but not of the world. Spread Christ's Kingdom by word and work. Keep our souls innocent. Control greed, unworthy vice and thoughts, and extravagant living. Live with simplicity and wholesomeness for the good of our souls and for the example we give others. Lead others to God. Live the spirit of submission – Jesus, I trust in You!
- 7. The five knots in our TOF cord are:
 - a. Poverty Live in one's own station in life, in poverty of spirit, humility, simplicity, and purity of heart.
 - b. Chastity no sin against our own bodies, which are temples of the Holy Spirit. covetousness nor jealousy. Maintain purity within our status in life.
 - c. Obedience to God "Jesus, I trust in You." Jesus died out of obedience to God and for love of us. We must strive for the same.

- d. Penance Atonement for our sins. Reconciliation (Confession) with God. Be a public example.
- e. <u>Detachment</u> We are here to please God, not necessarily others. God is first in our lives.

We then prayed for the intercessions of our members:

- 1. Spiritual and physical healing (see Infirmarian Report); Fr. Furlong's mother; Sheila Burtscher; Christopher (Judith Hoyt's great grandson); Tim Williams; and Gertie O'Kennedy and her caregivers.
- 2. Intentions in the prayer journal.
- 3. Our country, that it stays free of sin and immorality, including the end of abortion. In reparation for past and current sins.
- 4. The blessing of the Holy Spirit on our fraternity and those in discernment.
- 5. Pope Francis and the magisterium, that they remain faithful to the teaching of the Church.
- 6. Public officials, that they remember they are servants of the people.
- 7. Those affected by the Ukraine War.
- 8. Fr. Robert Campagna, OFM, Bishop Bonnar of Youngstown, Bishop Malesic of Cleveland, Bishop Lach, SJ of the Eparchy of Parma, Fr. Miron Kerul-Kmec, Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF, Fr. Ryan Furlong, TOF, Fr. Dennis Arambasick, OFM, Fr. Gastor Bahati, and all our pastors and parish priests.
- 9. Seminarians Frater Francis Tumaini of the Diocese of Moshi, Joseph Rohan of the Diocese of Cleveland, Arthur Bodenschatz of the Diocese of Youngstown, and all the seminarians of Borromeo/St. Mary Seminaries and Ss. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary.
- 10. We recited the St. Michael Prayer.

Roberto led us in the closing Ritual Prayer. And Roberto reminded us of our next Gathering, which will be July 17, 2022 at St. Nicholas Byzantine Church.
