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Something to Consider

The Catholic Quote selected for this month is from Fr. Alfred Delp, SJ, who was imprisoned and tortured by the Nazis from July 1944 to February 2, 1945, when he was executed at the age of 37.

During this time of waiting, Father chose to reflect deeply on Advent, which is also a time of waiting. Not only did he strive to forgive those who tortured him, and who he knew very well would eventually murder him, he wanted to keep bitterness and fear out of his heart.

Father came to realize that oppression, war, and hard times also bring certain spiritual gifts. During his imprisonment, he was visited by a Jesuit priest who covertly received him into the Jesuit Order, for which he had studied and prayed for many years. Besides his Ordination as a priest, this was his most treasured desire, even though Catholic priests and Jesuits in particular were seen as enemies of the German Reich. He secretly celebrated Mass daily, comforted fellow prisoners, and slipped out his meditations on little scraps of paper, including the quote below. The SS tormented him every day and told him if he refuted his Catholic Faith and priesthood, he would be released. With inner joy, he declined.

Father's cause for beatification is being investigated by the Vatican. Even if he is never beatified or canonized, he reminds us never to give up on our Faith, and that there is much to be gained from waiting. Waiting isn't a time of impatience or dread, but rather of preparation for a joyful reunion with Jesus, whether it is in our inevitable death, or in the birth of our dear Lord after all the prayer, self-improvement, and sacrifices of Advent.

Christ is born! Glory to God in the Highest!



Eucharistic Adoration and Daily Prayer


Council asks those of us who participate in Eucharistic Adoration – and the rest of our fraternity - to remember the following intentions every day when you pray:

- 1. The spiritual protection of our fraternity and of all our members.
- 2. Those in our fraternity who are sick, and their families.
- 3. **Pope Francis** and his intentions.
- 4. Our bishops: **Bishop David Bonnar** of the Diocese of Youngstown, **Bishop Milan Lach, SJ** of the Eparchy of Parma, **Bishop Earl Fernandes** of the Diocese of Columbus, and **Bishop Edward Malesic, JCL** of the Diocese of Cleveland.
- 5. The Friars of the Immaculate Conception Province of the OFM, particularly **Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM**, **Fr. Dennis Arambasick, OFM**, and **Fr. Robert Campagna, OFM**, who is the Provincial Minister.
- 6. Our beloved, hard-working pastors and parish priests, and our parishes, including Fr. Miron Kerul-Kmec, who hosts our fraternity every month. We also pray for Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF, an

Isolated Tertiary who is the pastor of St. George Byzantine Parish in Olympia, Washington, as well as a professor at SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary. And **Fr. Ryan Furlong, TOF** of the Padre Pio Fraternity.

- 7. **Fr. Gastor Temu Bahati**, a priest of the Diocese of Moshi, whom we have spiritually supported for several years.
- 8. **Frater Francis Tumaini** of the Diocese of Moshi, who is the seminarian we have adopted.
- 9. All the seminarians of St. Mary Seminary and Borromeo Seminary in Cleveland, which serves the Youngstown and Cleveland Dioceses, as well as the seminarians of SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary, which serves the Eparchy of Parma. Our fraternity has spiritually adopted a
 - seminarian from Stark County (**Arthur Bodenschatz**, Christ the Servant Parish in Canton), from Summit County (**Joseph Rohan**, St. Joseph Parish in Cuyahoga Falls), and from Capuchin Formation (**Christopher Klobuchir**). We have also added **Alex Krukemeyer** (Our Lady of Victory Parish in Tallmadge) from Summit County.
- 10. Finally, you may want to add prayers for the safety and protection of our Ukrainian brothers and sisters, and for the conversion of Russia as Pope Francis has done in his Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on March 25. Also, for the protection of Catholic priests, religious, and lay people everywhere, particularly in Nigeria, Nicaragua, and other countries where our Faith is being attacked.

That's a lot! But it is part of our holy Franciscan vocation to prayerfully support our fellow Franciscans, the Pope, our bishops, our priests, and seminarians and anyone in distress and danger. We have no Order without faithful Franciscans, no priests without our seminarians, no Eucharist without our priests, and no Church without the Eucharist. All these individuals on the list sacrifice daily for us, and the very least we can do is to pray for them!





← 2022 Profession

After we wound up this brief snack and social time, Pepe Ventosa, TOF gave us a short biography of Fr. Vit. For those

who were not familiar with his story, Father was raised in Communist Czechoslovakia, with little contact with

religion, since spirituality of any kind is oppressed by Communist leadership. He is blessed with considerable musical talent and entered a prestigious music academy as a pre-teen to study cello, piano, and other instruments, and musical theory. He eventually became a music instructor and a member of the Czechoslovakia National Symphony. While on an international tour in Toronto, Father went out for a walk on a snowy day and stopped in a doorway to warm up. It turned out to be the Franciscan motherhouse, and a Brother opened the door, invited him in to get warm and have a snack, and talked about Catholicism for a couple of hours. Father started attending Sunday Mass, then Daily Mass, then entered the Franciscan seminary – and the rest is history! We are blessed to be under his spiritual guidance.

- Our morning session was on "The Spiritual Life with an Emphasis on our Franciscan Vocation." Father led us in the Our Father to begin.
 - a. Father discussed interior exile per St. John Climacus.
 - b. This involves detachment from worldly distractions in order to grow closer to God.
 - c. Decide you will serve God.
 - d. Renounce what separates you from God.
 - e. Do not let worldly distractions master you or become the source of your joy.
 - f. Trust Jesus!
- 2. What can Isolated Tertiaries do to grow in their spiritual life and live their vocation when they aren't part of a fraternity?
 - a. It is like being a hermit.
 - b. Keep in touch via Zoom meetings.
 - c. Place yourself under the spiritual direction of a good priest.
 - d. Stay in communication with the TOF family.
 - e. Always remember that mortal sin means to make a pact with the devil. Attend Adoration and Confession often.
- 3. For a successful and holy religious life:
 - a. Be close to God.
 - b. Do not fear demons they should fear you!
- 4. What is meant by "kingdom" (i.e., the Kingdom of God)?
 - a. Anywhere God is the leader, and where his followers dwell, is His Kingdom. We should embrace the Kingdom and become part of it.

At 11 PM, Fr. Dennis and Fr. Vit offered Adoration and Confession in the church. Fr. Dennis led Benediction at the end.

At Noon, we ate a delicious lunch catered by a local Youngstown charity which employs young people in need of work. The St. Padre Pio fraternity ensured we mixed among our fraternities by placing us with members of other fraternities at the tables, which was a great idea! Lots of good conversation along with a good meal for everyone present!

After we wrapped up our meal, Kenny Green, TOF, Debbie Ventosa, TOF, and Bill Marshall, TOF led us in Liturgy of the Hours. This was followed by prayers and remembrance of our beloved dead, including those who entered eternal life during the pandemic. Richard Russelo, TOF, Betty Smith, OFS, and Mary Wagner, OFS were remembered by our fraternity – all of them dear to us and missed for their Franciscan example of faithfulness.

The afternoon session opened with Fr. Vit exploring the following:

- 1. How can we know Jesus as St. Francis did?
 - a. Through Lectio Divina.
 - b. Meditation. What does Jesus say to me? Put yourself in the picture.

- c. Study commentaries on Scripture from trusted, faithful sources.
- d. Prayer, whether it is for intercession or deliverance. Make it part of your life.
- e. Contemplate. See your world as God sees it and respond as He does.

With Fr. Vit's blessing, we concluded our Day of Recollection. We look forward to being together again next year!
