Eight members of our Fraternity traveled to Huntington, Indiana, for a Franciscan Retreat hosted by the Confraternity of Penitents, a lay Franciscan group that seeks to live in their homes by the original Third Order Rule of

1221. We were also joined by members of Tau-Maria, another lay Franciscan group that follows a Rule devoted

The Retreat took place at the St Felix Catholic Center, a repurposed Capuchin monastery. Its most notable resident was Blessed Solanus Casey for some ten years. Eucharistic Adoration and Daily Prayer


Council asks those of us who participate in Eucharistic Adoration – and the rest of our fraternity - to remember the following intentions every day when you pray:

- 1. The spiritual protection of our fraternity and of all our members.
- 2. Those in our fraternity who are sick, and their families.

- 3. Pope Francis and his intentions.
- 4. Our bishops: **Bishop David Bonnar** of the Diocese of Youngstown, **Bishop Milan Lach, SJ** of the Eparchy of Parma, **Bishop Earl Fernandes** of the Diocese of Columbus, and **Bishop Edward Malesic, JCL** of the Diocese of Cleveland.
- 5. The Friars of the Immaculate Conception Province of the OFM, particularly **Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM**, **Fr. Dennis Arambasick, OFM**, and **Fr. Robert Campagna, OFM**, who is the Provincial Minister.
- 6. Our beloved pastors and parish priests, and our parishes, including **Fr. Miron Kerul-Kmec**, who hosts our fraternity every month. We also pray for **Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF**, an Isolated Tertiary who is the pastor of St.

George Byzantine Parish in Olympia, Washington, as well as a professor at SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary. And **Fr. Ryan Furlong, TOF** of the Padre Pio Fraternity.

- 7. **Fr. Gastor Temu Bahati**, a priest of the Diocese of Moshi, whom we have spiritually supported for several years.
- 8. **Frater Francis Tumaini** of the Diocese of Moshi, who is the seminarian we have adopted.
- 9. All the seminarians of St. Mary Seminary and Borromeo Seminary in Cleveland, which serves the Youngstown and Cleveland Dioceses, as well as the seminarians of SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary, which serves the Eparchy of Parma. Our fraternity has spiritually adopted a seminarian from Stark County (Arthur Bodenschatz, Christ the Servant Parish in Canton), from Summit County (Joseph Rohan, St. Joseph Parish in Cuyahoga Falls), and from Capuchin Formation (Christopher Klobuchir). We have also recently added Alex Krukemeyer from Summit County.



- 10. Our beloved and hard-working parish priests.
- 11. Finally, you may want to add prayers for the safety and protection of our Ukrainian brothers and sisters, and for the conversion of Russia as Pope Francis has done in his Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on March 25. Also, for the protection of Catholic priests, religious, and lay people everywhere, particularly in Nigeria, Nicaragua, and other countries where our Faith is being attacked.

That's a lot! But it is part of our holy Franciscan vocation to prayerfully support our fellow Franciscans, the Pope, our bishops, our priests, and seminarians and anyone in distress and danger. We have no Order without faithful Franciscans, no priests without our seminarians, no Eucharist without our priests, and no Church without the Eucharist. All these individuals on the list sacrifice daily for us, and the very least we can do is to pray for them!

Lord, It Is Good for Us to Be Together!

Vice Minister Jim Miller, TOF called the group to order at 1:30 PM on Sunday, October 16 at St. Nicholas Byzantine Parish. We had 21 in attendance, in addition to Annie Butts, Fred Kramer, and Fr. Vit. Roberto and Maria Elena Meza, TOF were excused from the Gathering so they could attend a Mass of Thanksgiving at the Basilica of St. John in Canton for couples in the Diocese celebrating milestone anniversaries. Bishop Bonnar presided at the Mass, where the Mezas were honored for their marriage of 40 years along with others. **Congratulations, Roberto and Maria Elena, and many more years!** We were also *delighted* to welcome back Jennifer Kerns, TOF, who has been away for some time due to health concerns. Her smiling face was a beautiful addition to our Gathering!

Jim Miller, TOF led us in the opening Ritual Prayers. Kenny Green, TOF and Bill Marshall, TOF led us in Midday Liturgy of the Hours

Lectio Divina was led by Virgil Daniel, TOF. The reading was from the Sunday's Gospel, St. Luke, Chapter 18, the parable of the judge and the persistent widow. We discussed what spoke to our hearts at our tables and prayed together.

Jim Miller, TOF led us in prayer, and we enjoyed lunch prepared by Fred and Susan Kramer, TOF, Mary Dye, TOF, and Annie Butts.

During lunch, Jim Miller, TOF went over the plans for the Day of Recollection, which will serve as our November Gathering and will take place on Saturday, November 12. We should plan to arrive in Youngstown around 8:45 AM, since Mass will start at 9 AM. There will be no breakfast this year, so be sure to get a bite to eat at home before leaving. The day will also include Confession and Adoration, as well as question and answer sessions with Fr. Vit, and a catered lunch at noon. Our day will conclude around 3:15. Virgil Daniel, TOF pointed out that there will be a 5 PM Divine Liturgy at the beautiful Byzantine parish opposite the Shrine for anyone who wants to attend that in order to fulfill the Sunday duty.

After lunch, Joanne Angeletti, TOF led us in Ongoing Formation on Article 47 of the Constitution:

- 1. **Spiritual Poverty**: Improve on the quality of prayer and understanding. Memorize ejaculations (such as "Jesus, Son of the Living God, have mercy on me, a sinner) for quick prayers during the day.
- 2. **Ask for help from the Guardian Angels and Patron Saints**: God gave us our guardian angels to help of in times of trouble, when we might be placed in potentially dangerous situations. And patron saints and blessed know first-hand the troubles life sometimes hands us. We can always call on them for help.
- 3. **Be in God's presence at all times**: Ways to accomplish this include daily Mass, Liturgy of the Hours, monthly Confession, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, reading Scripture, and so many other ways we can bring God into every day of our lives.
- 4. **Temporal poverty**: Share with the needy and pray for others. Give until it hurts! We don't have far to look for those who need our help. Follow the example of St. Francis, who gave up his luxurious life to live in discomfort and often hunger. We don't have to give everything up, but sometimes a little help goes a long way for those in trouble. And we can all afford a few extra prayers for those we love and for those who don't love us.

Jim Miller, TOF discussed the upcoming retreat in Indiana, which will include teaching from Fr. Vit and Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF of Olympia, Washington, who is part of our Isolated Tertiary community and Formation team. At this point, there are eight members committed to attending. Jim urged those considering the trip to contact him or Roberto ASAP. There will be arrangements for carpooling, and funds are available for those who need assistance (please contact Therese Harper, TOF or anyone on Council for this).

Jim updated us on the Day of Recollection at the Shrine of Our Lady, Comforter of the Afflicted in Youngstown on Saturday, November 12. Mary Dye, TOF is keeping a headcount, and Council asks that anyone who plans to attend to RSVP to her very soon. The cost of the catered lunch is \$12 per person, and we should pay ahead of time. The day will start with Mass at 9 AM, and will include Confession, Adoration, question and answer sessions with Fr. Vit, lunch, and the prayerful remembrance of our deceased members. The day will end at approximately 3:15 PM.

The Infirmarian Report included the happy news that Jennifer Kerns, TOF is back with us! We have prayed for Jennifer for the last several months and will continue to do so for the duration. Rick Dunlap, TOF asked for prayers for Eileen, who is under the weather and could not attend, as well as for Eileen's dear mother, Gertie. We were reminded to pray for our absent members who have been on our ongoing list for some time.

Virgil Daniel, TOF gave us the Formation Report. Jesse Kuhn and Denise Williams only have one more class before their Profession, which will take place on the Day of Recollection. They are ready! The incoming class currently has eight members. They will meet Tuesdays at St. Nicholas twice monthly. Virgil asked for new helpers to assist with the Formation classes, which are planned out by Debbie Ventosa, TOF. Think about it!

Virgil and Louise Daniel, TOF shared an icon of St. Francis of Assisi, and Brother Donald Thielsen, OFM Conv. blessed it. Brother Donald led our Transitus last month. The icon is a third-class relic, and very beautiful.

We discussed ideas for Ongoing Formation, besides studying the Constitution, which we have been doing for some time. Some of the ideas were to go into the Admonitions of St. Francis, to explore the lives of Franciscan saints such as St. Padre Pio and St. Maximilian Kolbe, and to learn how to live our Franciscan vocation in modern life.

Bill Marshall, TOF, Joanne Angeletti, TOF, and Mary Dye, TOF gave a public witness and prayer at the Stand for Live in October, which is much appreciated. There is no one scheduled for this apostolate for the months of November, December, and January due to the severe weather we often experience in those months.

The Little Portion for October was prepared by Mary Cate Roberts, TOF and delivered by Kenny Green, TOF. There will be no Little Portion in November since our Gathering will be held on November 12 in Youngstown at the Shrine of Our Lady Comforter of the Afflicted.

As noted above, the November Gathering will be at the Shrine in Youngstown on Saturday, November 12.

The relics of St. Angela Merici are in the custody of Larry and Lucy McNutt, TOF currently. Carol Perrine, TOF is caring for the relic of St. Frances Cabrini. The statue of St. Clare and the portrait of Blessed Luchessio and Belladonna are both available for anyone who wants to venerate them in their home.

Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish was selected for the food pantry donation, which Cindy Russo, TOF will deliver.

We then prayed for our usual intentions and others:

- 2. Our families and friends, as well as all in our Franciscan family worldwide.
- 3. Those who were absent from the Gathering.
- 4. The United States of America and for an end to our offenses against God's Will.
- 5. To bless our fraternity and to give us new vocations.
- 6. For an end of the persecution of the Church both here and abroad, especially in Ukraine, Nigeria, and other nations where Catholics suffer and are in danger.
- 7. Pope Francis.
- 8. Against secularism.
- 9. An end to the Ukraine War.
- 10. Our Bishops (Bishop Bonnar of Youngstown, Bishop Lach, SJ of the Eparchy of Parma, Bishop Earl Fernandes of Columbus, and Bishop Malesic, JCL of Cleveland) and the priests connected to our community (Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF, Fr. Ryan Furlong, TOF, Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM, Fr. Dennis Arambasick, OFM, and Fr. Miron Kerul-Kmec).
- 11. Our beloved parish priests.
- 12. Prayer of St. Michael

Fr. Vit then offered his Ongoing Formation. He spoke on Spiritual and Temporal Poverty.

- 1. **Prayer:** When we pray, ask for something in particular (healing, blessing, etc.) This is beneficial for salvation and will deepen our Faith. It also promotes growth in virtue.
- 2. **We must be more preoccupied with God than with things.** We must focus on God and be in His presence. One idea is to live in "constant Lent" in preparation for the coming of God.
- 3. How do I do this?
 - a. Avoid quick change. Make gradual changes for the good that are lasting.
 - b. Avoid entertainment that is scandalous and separates us from God.
 - c. Avoid accumulating possessions that are unnecessary.

- 4. Authentic prayer brings peace and joy.
- **5. Jesus didn't care what others thought of Him.** He wanted only to please God. This is the example we should follow. It's okay not to be liked. It liberates us from worldliness.
- 6. If you have a good Confessor, he will not only absolve you, but also give you spiritual direction.
- 7. The first principal of spiritual life: Mind your business, and the second is to be empathetic.

Fr. Vit led us in the concluding prayers and gave us his blessing.
