Something to Consider

Sometimes, God sends the right person exactly when and where he or she is needed and gives that person extraordinary graces to do His Will.

Pope Benedict XVI was one of those people. Although he was born under very humble circumstances, and grew up during the worldwide Depression, he was blessed to be part of a very devout and loving Catholic family and surrounded by the beauty of Bavaria, music, and the Church. Later, young Joseph Ratzinger was required by Nazi authorities to join the Hitler Youth organization, even though he and his family were strongly anti-Nazi. At 17, he was forced to join the German military in the final days of World War II. He promptly deserted and spent the last few weeks of World War II in an American POW camp, where he celebrated his 18th birthday.

After VE Day and his release from detention in the POW camp, Joseph returned home in June of 1945. He and his brother Georg decided to enter the seminary together, and they both were ordained June 29, 1951. Fr. Joseph was never a parish priest since he possessed the God-given gifts of great intellect and the secondary vocation of being an inspired teacher. Instead, he became a university professor of theology. His convincing, logical, and faithful teaching brought him to the attention of the Church hierarchy. Fr. Joseph eventually was named a bishop and then a cardinal. He was head of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith for many years. He was also a firm and loyal friend and adviser of St. John Paul II, who also suffered but strengthened his Faith in the face of Naziism and Communism.

Pope Benedict had a great appreciation of beauty, not only in the Liturgy, but music. He was an accomplished pianist and was very fond of the works of Mozart. And he had great affection for cats. When he was a cardinal, he often shyly greeted visitors in St. Peter's Square as he walked to work. He led us well and faithfully.

Sometimes it may feel that we are given circumstances we cannot control. It may then be good to remember our dear Pope Benedict, who overcame everything with the confidence he placed in doing God's Will and in always following His plans.



Eucharistic Adoration and Daily Prayer

Council asks those of us who participate in Eucharistic Adoration – and the rest of our fraternity - to remember the following intentions every day when you pray:

- 1. The spiritual protection of our fraternity and of all our members.
- 2. Those in our fraternity who are sick, and their families.
- 3. **Pope Francis** and his intentions.
- 4. Our bishops: **Bishop David Bonnar** of the Diocese of Youngstown, **Bishop Milan Lach, SJ** of the Eparchy of Parma, **Bishop Earl Fernandes** of the Diocese of Columbus, and **Bishop Edward Malesic, JCL** of the Diocese of Cleveland.
- 5. The Friars of the Immaculate Conception Province of the OFM, particularly **Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM**, **Fr. Dennis Arambasick, OFM**, and **Fr. Robert Campagna, OFM**, who is the Provincial Minister.
- 6. Our beloved, hard-working pastors and parish priests, and our parishes, including Fr. Miron Kerul-Kmec, who hosts our fraternity every month. We also pray for Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF, an
 - Isolated Tertiary who is the pastor of St. George Byzantine Parish in Olympia, Washington, as well as a professor at SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary. And **Fr. Ryan Furlong, TOF** of the St. Padre Pio Fraternity.
- 7. **Fr. Gastor Temu Bahati**, a priest of the Diocese of Moshi, whom we have spiritually supported for several years.
- 8. **Frater Francis Tumaini** of the Diocese of Moshi, who is the seminarian we have adopted.
- 9. All the seminarians of St. Mary Seminary and Borromeo Seminary in Cleveland, which serves the Youngstown and Cleveland Dioceses, as well as the seminarians of SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary, which serves the Eparchy of Parma. Our fraternity has spiritually adopted a seminarian from Stark County (Arthur Bodenschatz, Christ the Servant
 - Parish in Canton), from Summit County (**Joseph Rohan**, St. Joseph Parish in Cuyahoga Falls), and from Capuchin Formation (**Christopher Klobuchir**). We have also added **Alex Krukemeyer** (Our Lady of Victory Parish in Tallmadge) from Summit County.
- 10. Finally, you may want to add prayers for the safety and protection of our Ukrainian brothers and sisters, and for the conversion of Russia as Pope Francis has done in his Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Also, for the protection of Catholic priests, religious, and lay people everywhere, particularly in Nigeria, Nicaragua, and other countries where our Faith is being attacked.

That's a lot! But it is part of our holy Franciscan vocation to prayerfully support our fellow Franciscans, the Pope, our bishops, our priests, and seminarians and anyone in distress and danger. We have no Order without faithful Franciscans, no priests without our seminarians, no Eucharist without our priests, and no Church without the Eucharist. All these individuals on the list sacrifice daily for us, and the very least we can do is to pray for them!

Fraternity Formation

Our Community Statutes states in Article 4.1 that "the purpose of Formation in the community of Tertiaries is 'to form its members in Christian perfection' (ref Sacra Propediem 16) by giving them a better understanding of their divine call to holiness and by guiding and assisting them in observing the Holy Gospel according to the example of St. Francis of Assisi."

Initial Formation: please describe your program for Initial Formation (i.e., formation team, number of meetings per month, length of sessions, materials/curriculum used, etc.)

The team presently consists of 2 professed members plus several assistants that attend on an "as needed" basis. Team meets twice a month with each session lasting about 2 hrs.

Curriculum includes prayer, Lectio Divina, Franciscan symbols/traditions.

<u>Books:</u> Scripture, Catechism of the Catholic Church, TOF Rule/Constitutions, "Call to Commitment in the School of St. Francis", and "New Catechism of the Third Order". Other references include: "Admonitions of St. Francis", and Biographies of Franciscan Saints.

Please explain how this program brings to fruition the purpose of formation for novices as stated in Art. 4.1.

Promoting a spirit of prayer brings discernment on God's calling, which assists in the development of docility and obedience to the Holy Spirit. Novices also are learning how to live our Franciscan vocation in everyday life and secular culture, as well as how to defend the faith. Learning about the life of St. Francis makes real the opportunity we all have to become saints and encourages all to reach the perfection of Christian charity.

Ongoing Formation: please describe Ongoing Formation at gatherings (i.e., presenter, material used, format, etc.) and at other occasions outside of gatherings.

All members are encouraged to participate in Ongoing Formation which is presented by members of the Fraternity and by Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM, our spiritual director. Also, the practice of prayer at the gathering is part of formation. This year we continued to study the Constitutions of the TOF.

Outside the gatherings:

- Held an annual Pilgrimage in May 2022
- Participated in Transitus at St. Nicholas Church
- Met with other Franciscan Tertiary communities at the St. Clare Monastery to plan for the annual retreat
- Joined the Confraternity of Penitents in their annual retreat on Oct 2022 in IN
- Participated in the Annual Day of Recollection on 11/12/2022
- We publish the monthly "Mat Post", email to members for their on-going formation

Please explain how this program brings to fruition the purpose of formation for your fraternity members as stated in Art. 4.1.

Promoting prayer and the Franciscan way of life encourages each of us in our path to holiness. Studying the constitution encourages practical application of the rule in our daily lives.

- Participated in Transitus, led by Br. Donald Thiessen, OFM
- In October 2022, members of our Fraternity attended and assisted by giving presentations at the annual retreat of the Confraternity of Penitents
- Assisted in the preparation for the Annual Day of Recollection on 11/12/2022
- Assisted in on-going formation and additional formation for the members of the community of isolated Tertiaries throughout the year

Does your fraternity have a newsletter? Yes, Il Poverello, goes out monthly.

Describe activities/ministries/apostolates of your fraternity that assists in the works of the local Church.

- At the Fraternity gathering each January, items are collected for donation to the local pregnancy support center
- At the end of the year bibles are purchased with donations and delivered to one of the prisons in OH
- At each gathering nonperishable food items are collected for donation to a local parishes' food pantry
- Provide food for the homeless
- Provide financial assistance to a seminarian in the Moshi Diocese of Tanzania
- Provide spiritual support to seminarians of the Dioceses of Cleveland, Youngstown and Moshi.

- Spiritually adopted 3 seminarians from the Cleveland and Youngstown Diocese
- On 9/3/2022 members manned the pro-life booth at the Annual Stark County Fair
- Participation monthly in pro-life prayer in front of abortion facilities
- Regular participation in liturgical and ministerial activities, in member's home parishes, for example eucharistic ministers of Holy Communion, lectors, catechists, singers, altar servers, etc.


