

Be sure to always remain on the sidewalk. If you cannot fulfill your commitment, find a substitute. *NEVER* go alone to the clinic – pray from home if your partner will be absent and you cannot find a substitute.

Diocese of Cleveland Men's Conference by Virgil Daniel, TOF

As one of the many interesting talks given at the Cleveland Men's Conference on March 18, the Executive Director of Ohio Right to Life spoke on the topic of the initiative to place on the November ballot an Ohio constitutional amendment that would essentially enshrine so-called abortion rights into law.

You've probably seen the very dramatic ad campaign from Protect Women Ohio on the TV. It is important to know that Planned Parenthood has enlisted the energy and expertise of the same group that was behind similar initiatives in Kansas and Kentucky last November. Thankfully, they failed in Kentucky; but we all remember the hype and media energy around the success in Kansas. This can't happen in Ohio, but that is the focus of Planned Parenthood's efforts.

The proposed amendment, besides various abortion provisions, also includes privacy "protections" for minors to obtain so-called "gender affirming medical treatments" without parental knowledge or permission. That's egregious!

Consider this scenario – your daughter/granddaughter becomes pregnant. Rather than coming to you, she seeks counsel from her soccer coach. The coach helps her to procure an abortion, without your knowledge. Under this proposed amendment, should you later find out, the coach is protected from

your lawsuit as the amendment makes the coach's action perfectly legal, providing legal protection from your seeking redress.

The money funding this initiative comes from the usual sources. Yet, the Ohio Capital Journal (16 March 2023) proclaims that Protect Women Ohio is "a dark money 501.c.4 organization." "Dark money" to fight abortion? Really!!! You can see the need for us all to stand up and reaffirm the sanctity of life in the womb, that life begins at conception and is fully human in that moment, body and soul.

Eucharistic Adoration and Daily Prayer

Council asks those of us who participate in Eucharistic Adoration – and the rest of our fraternity - to remember the following intentions every day when you pray:

- 1. The spiritual protection of our fraternity and of all our members.
- 2. Those in our fraternity who are sick, and their families.
- 3. **Pope Francis** and his intentions.
- 4. Our bishops: **Bishop David Bonnar** of the Diocese of Youngstown, **Bishop Kurt Burnette** of the Eparchy of Parma, **Bishop Earl Fernandes** of the Diocese of Columbus, and **Bishop Edward Malesic**, **JCL** of the Diocese of Cleveland.
- 5. The Friars of the Immaculate Conception Province of the OFM, particularly Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM, Fr. Dennis Arambasick, OFM, and Fr. Robert Campagna, OFM, who is the Provincial Minister.
- 6. Our beloved, hard-working pastors and parish priests, and our parishes, including Fr. Miron Kerul'-Kmec of St. Nicholas Byzantine Parish, who hosts our fraternity every month. We also pray for Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF, an Isolated Tertiary who is the pastor of St. George Byzantine Parish in
 - Olympia, Washington and St. Irene Byzantine Parish in Portland, Oregon, as well as a professor at SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary. And **Fr. Ryan Furlong, TOF** of the Diocese of Youngstown and of the St. Padre Pio Fraternity.
- 7. **Fr. Gastor Temu Bahati**, of the Diocese of Moshi who is serving on the staff of his bishop, whom we have spiritually supported for several years.
- 8. Frater Francis Tumaini of the Diocese of Moshi, who is the Moshi seminarian we have adopted.
- 9. All the seminarians of St. Mary Seminary and Borromeo Seminary in Cleveland, which serves the Youngstown and Cleveland Dioceses, as well as the seminarians of SS. Cyril and Methodius
 - Byzantine Seminary, which serves the Eparchy of Parma. Our fraternity has spiritually adopted Arthur Bodenschatz, Christ the Servant Parish in Canton, Joseph Rohan, St. Joseph Parish in Cuyahoga Falls, and Alex Krukemeyer (Our Lady of Victory Parish in Tallmadge) from Summit County. We have also taken on John Paul Antalek (St. Mary Parish in Akron), who has been accepted to the Fall class at Borromeo Seminary. (John Paul Antalek, future Borromeo seminarian)



- 10. Please add prayers for the safety and protection of our Ukrainian brothers and sisters, and for the conversion of Russia as Pope Francis has done in his Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Also, for the protection of Catholic priests, religious, and lay people everywhere, particularly in Nigeria, Peru, Nicaragua, and other countries where our Faith is being attacked.
- 11. Bishop David Bonnar of the Diocese of Youngstown has asked for prayers for the **victims of the train derailment in East Palestine**, which is in the Diocese. Fr. David Misbrenner, who hosted a profession Mass for our fraternity a few years ago at St. Peter of the Fields in Brimfield, is currently pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes in East Palestine, and he has been a friend to our fraternity.

That's a lot! But it is part of our holy Franciscan vocation to prayerfully support our fellow Franciscans, the Pope, our bishops, our priests, and seminarians and anyone in distress and danger. We have no Order without faithful Franciscans, no priests without our seminarians, no Eucharist without our priests, and no Church without the Eucharist. All these individuals on the list sacrifice daily for us, and the very least we can do is to pray for them!

- Virgil Daniel, TOF read the Gospel of the Third Sunday of Lent, (Jesus restores the sight of the blind man). Each table discussed what we heard and how we can bring this message to our faith lives.
- Roberto Meza, TOF led Grace before we enjoyed our bagged lunches. Since this Gathering falls in the season of Lent, Council decided we would not enjoy our usual feast and instead bring our own simple packed lunches. Debbie Ventosa, TOF kindly brought her delicious bean soup to supplement this.

- Virgil Daniel, TOF addressed us on the Diocese of Cleveland Men's Conference, which he
 attended with his son, Troy. There was an excellent presentation given on the status of the prolife movement in Ohio and an update on what anti-life leaders are putting on the upcoming
 election ballot.
- Debbie Ventosa, TOF led Ongoing Formation in place of Mary Cate Roberts, TOF, who has suffered a debilitating injury. She discussed Article 49, Section II of the Rule of the Third Order, which deals with the discipline of living.
 - o Remember the wisdom of temperance when eating and drinking.
 - o Gluttony is a venial sin.
 - Let prudence be your guide.
 - Plain and simple should guide Franciscans.
 - Eat what is set before you.
 - Do not forget to pray before and after meals.
 - Fast for the Feasts of the Immaculate Virgin Mary and of St. Francis on the day before each solemnity, as well as on Fridays, and abstain from meat on Wednesdays and Fridays.
- Debbie Ventosa, TOF introduced the Inquirers who will soon be Postulants Marlene Walker, and Dennis and Carolyn Gacioch. We are asked to pray for their discernment and studies.
- Maria Elena Meza, TOF gave the Infirmarian report.
 - Judith Hoyt, TOF reports that Sandy Pollino, OFS and Dorothy Takacs, OFS remain the same in their illnesses. Sandy has written a book and it is ready for the publisher.
 - o Bob Burtscher, TOF said that Elizabeth Francis, TOF is in good spirits and keeping busy

 - The natural world is ours.
 - o The supernatural world is God's.
 - o The Church started with Jews and pagans (Gentiles).
 - The spirit of the world and the spirit of God are incompatible.
 - Early Christians blessed everything they brought into the house because it came from a pagan world.
 - Paganism is attacking the Church right now.
 - America is no longer Christian.
 - Hypnosis, acupuncture, Eastern medicine and teachings, may become portals to the soul through which demons can enter. This may manifest at a later time. These "remedies" may remove pain but will not heal. They can also result in depression, broken marriages, and suicide.
 - o Yoga and reiki are incompatible with Christianity because it is a Hindu practice related to

- reincarnation. It has to do with worship of false Hindu gods.
- Anything to do with the occult witchcraft, Wicca, etc. is demonic. This includes Ouija boards, tarot cards, crystal balls, etc.
- Only exorcism can remove demons.
- o Prayer is far stronger and more effective than anything the occult offers.
- o Demons can affect electronics. They infect science often.
- Reiki is also to be avoided by Christians. It is a spiritually dangerous practice.
- We must educate ourselves if we do not want to be misled by unfaithful leadership.
- The pantry collection went to St. Nicholas.
- April 23 is the next Gathering! (We are delaying one week because of Divine Mercy Sunday, which is April 16).
- Fr. Vit led us in the Ritual Closing Prayer and gave us his blessing.
