Something to Consider



As we should all be well aware, we are in the midst of a worldwide Eucharistic Revival – the Church's effort to rekindle great devotion to the Eucharist for every Catholic. And since April is the month of the Blessed Sacrament, it is only appropriate for us to give our attention to Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament.

As with everything He did, it was no coincidence that Jesus used a holy meal – the Passover supper – to introduce His disciples to the

Blessed Sacrament. The traditional Passover supper was something with which His followers were very familiar, and which they approached with great joy. When He blessed the bread and broke it, and said, "This is My Body," and then blessed the wine and said, "This is My Blood," He wanted them to specifically "do this in memory" of Him. And we Catholics have remembered our dear Jesus at every Divine Liturgy and Mass for the last 2,000 years, faithfully doing *exactly* as Jesus required of His disciples and priests, with no variations.

Beyond the privilege of daily and weekend Mass, there are other ways to honor Jesus' request to remember Him in the Blessed Sacrament. First, of course, we must be sure we are in a state of grace so that we may receive Him, which means regular and frequent Confession. Most of our parishes have regularly scheduled times when Confession is available every week, with the option of making an appointment with our parish priests for Reconciliation. Of course, there is also the option of visiting parishes other than one's own as well. Finding a faithful and holy Confessor is a great blessing. Making Confession a habit, perhaps monthly, is a good way to become more comfortable with this Sacrament of great mercy and of course, it prepares us properly to receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

Eucharistic Adoration is another way to be close to Jesus and to remember Him. Many parishes offer formal Adoration with the Host exposed in the monstrance. But there is also the option of making a private Holy Hour, as many of our members do every day of the week. Jesus in the tabernacle is just as present as He is in the monstrance.

Jesus is waiting for us in the Blessed Sacrament 24 hours per day, every day of the year. Don't be a stranger!



If you choose to witness to the Church's teaching on life by praying at the abortion clinic, don't forget our rules for your own safety. Remember to use the residential parking around the corner. Do not use business parking or Acme's parking – you will be towed. It may be easier to pray without distractions across the street, rather than in front of the clinic. Be sure to always remain on the sidewalk. If you cannot fulfill your commitment, find a substitute. *NEVER* go alone to the clinic – pray from home if your partner will be absent and you cannot find a substitute.

Formation News by Virgil Daniel, TOF

Several of our new Postulants and their formation team attended the Parish Mission offered at St. Francis de Sales Parish on Route 93 south of Akron. They were Charlotte Miller, Jerry Johnson, and John Wilson, along with Virgil Daniel, TOF, and Rose Akins, TOF. Kenny Green, TOF, was also in attendance.



The Mission was offered by Fr. Brian Stacey, OFM Cap., who is a native of Canal Fulton. Monday night, March 18, provided primarily a review of the life of St. Francis and several stories that Fr. Brian felt would help folks have a sense of who St. Francis was and why he still matters in the Church today. Tuesday, March 18, focused more on the spirituality of St. Francis. Fr. Brian noted that this was too broad to cover in just one hour; so, he picked his three favorite aspects to expound upon. First, that everything about Francis and his spirituality is Incarnational - from the Crib to Nothing is more core to St. the Cross. Francis' spiritual worldview than the Incarnation. Second, that St. Francis had "a

seraphic trust in the Providence of God." Finally, there is Francis' "Perfect Joy."



Pilgrimage Plans!

Paul Fedele, TOF, Minister of the Our Lady of America fraternity is hard at work, firming up the details of our upcoming Third Order Franciscan Community Pilgrimage in May. Here is the information he has shared so far:



On Saturday, May 4 we will meet at the Shrine of St. Elizabeth of Hungary (patroness of the Third Order Franciscans), which is located at 9016 Buckeye Rd., Cleveland, 44104.

The day will begin with the opportunity for Confession starting at 8:30 AM, followed by a Traditional Latin Mass (a low Mass). After Mass, Reverend Canon Hoogerwerf and Reverend Canon Bovee will lead us in spiritual reflections.

Around 11:30 AM, we will head for the shrine hall for lunch, which will be provided by Paul Fedele, TOF (he will accept free will offerings).

After lunch, we will pray the Stations of the Cross, followed by the Litany of the Saints and the Litany of Loreto (remembering that May 4 is the First Saturday and May is the month of our Blessed Mother Mary). The day should conclude around 2 PM or so.

Carpools may be arranged - more details to follow!

Evangelization Committee Being Formed submitted by Pepe Ventosa, TOF

We are in the process of forming an "Evangelization Committee" for our community. This committee will be composed of eight +/- members from the various fraternities, who will be "sent", at least "by two", to promote the Third Order of St. Francis. We are presented with many opportunities to promote the TOF, such as parish picnics, local Catholic Men/Women Conferences, and such, by setting up a display table with TOF information and sharing the Franciscan way of life with others. The SS. Francis and Clare have already participated in such events. The idea behind having a committee is to have a pool of volunteers from our fraternities from which 2 or 3 people can be selected to attend such an event. On the other hand, if you are "selected to volunteer" (9), please prayerfully consider it.

Pope Leo XIII, in his Encyclical Auspicato Concessum, p. 25, wrote: "We desire that by your endeavors especially it may be increased and extended to many... take pains that the people may become acquainted with the Third Order and truly esteem it; provide that those who have the cure of souls sedulously teach what it is, how easily anyone may enter it, with how great privileges tending to salvation it bounds, what advantages, public and private, it promises..."

Renewal of Profession

We will recite the Renewal of Profession at the April Gathering. It may be found on our website and is as follows:

Holy Trinity - Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, one God in three persons, I present myself before You, to give You thanks for all the blessings and mercies You have bestowed on me with so much bounty since the moment I came into the world.

I thank You in particular, O my God, for having made me a member of the Third Order of Your servant St. Francis.

I confess that the yoke of the holy Order is not heavy, that its obligations are not difficult,

and that its blessings are many and great.

I embrace anew the holy Rule of our glorious father St. Francis.

I ratify my profession and renew it with all my heart, promising again in the presence of Your Divine Majesty, in honor of the immaculate Virgin Mary, of blessed father Francis, and of all the saints, to observe all the time of my life the commandments of God and the Rule of the Third Order, as also to fulfill the penance imposed on me by my superiors for any transgressions against the Rule.

O my God, with the assistance of Your grace, I will, from this day forth, be more exact in the fulfillment of my duties as a Tertiary.

Deign to bless this my resolution.



Eucharistic Adoration and Daily Prayer

Council asks those of us who participate in Eucharistic Adoration – and the rest of our fraternity - to remember the following intentions every day when you pray:

- 1. The spiritual protection of our fraternity and of all our members.

- 3. **Pope Francis** and his intentions.
- 4. Our bishops and their intentions: **Bishop David Bonnar** of the Diocese of Youngstown, **Bishop Robert Pipta** of the Eparchy of Parma, **Bishop Earl Fernandes** of the Diocese of Columbus, and **Bishop Edward Malesic**, **ICL** of the Diocese of Cleveland.
- 5. The Friars of the Immaculate Conception Province of the OFM, particularly **Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM**, **Fr. Dennis Arambasick, OFM**, and **Fr. Robert Campagna, OFM**, who is the Provincial Minister.
- 6. Our beloved, hard-working pastors and parish priests, and our parishes, including Fr. Miron Kerul'-Kmec of St. Nicholas Byzantine Parish (Eparchy of Parma), who hosts our fraternity every month. We also pray for Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF, an Isolated Tertiary who is the pastor of St. George Byzantine Parish in
 - Olympia, Washington and St. Irene Byzantine Parish in Portland, Oregon, as well as being a professor at SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary and contributor to "Catholic Answers" on EWTN radio. And **Fr. Ryan Furlong, TOF,** who is pastor of St. Thomas the Apostle Parish in Vienna, St. William Parish in Champion, and St. Robert Bellarmine Parish in Cortland (Diocese of Youngstown) and who is a member of the St. Padre Pio Fraternity.
- 7. **Fr. Gastor Temu Bahati**, of the Diocese of Moshi who is serving on the staff of his bishop, whom we have spiritually supported for several years.
- 8. **Frater Francis Tumaini** of the Diocese of Moshi, who is the Moshi seminarian we have adopted.
- 9. All the seminarians of St. Mary Seminary and Borromeo Seminary in Cleveland, which serves the Youngstown and Cleveland Dioceses, as well as the seminarians of SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary, which serves the Eparchy of Parma. Our fraternity has spiritually adopted Arthur Bodenschatz, (St. Paul in North Canton) and William Martzaklis (St. Paul in North Canton) from the Diocese of Youngstown, Joseph Rohan,
 - (St. Joseph Parish in Cuyahoga Falls), **Alex Krukemeyer**, (Our Lady of Victory Parish in Tallmadge), **John Paul Antalek** (St. Mary Parish in Akron), all from the Diocese of Cleveland, and **Andrew Turpin** (University of Akron Newman Center, St. Bernard). These men, and Frater Francis of the Moshi Seminary, are the future leaders and servants of our Church.
- 10. Please add prayers for the safety and protection of our Ukrainian brothers and sisters, and for the conversion of Russia as Pope Francis has done in his Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Also, for the spiritual and physical protection of Catholic priests, religious, and lay people everywhere, particularly in Nigeria, Peru, Nicaragua, the Middle East, the Far East, and other countries where our Faith is being attacked.
- 11. For the **protection of all life**, born and unborn, womb to tomb.
- 12. For the blessing of an increase in priestly and religious vocations including the Third Order Franciscans, and for an increase of faithful Catholic marriages and families.

That's a lot! But it is part of our holy Franciscan vocation to prayerfully support our fellow Franciscans, the Pope, our bishops, our priests, and seminarians and anyone in distress and danger. We have no Order without prayerful Franciscans, no priests without our seminarians, no Eucharist without our priests, and no Church without the Eucharist. We all work together doing the mission God has given us, for His glory. All these individuals on the list sacrifice daily for us, and the very least we can do is to pray for them!

Franciscan Tertiaries' Tridua 2024 – by Pepe Ventosa, TOF

TRIDUA

Franciscan Tertiaries - OFM Province of the Immaculate Conception



What is a Tridua?

"As it is impossible for a great number of Tertiaries to be several days away from home or work, tridua, also known as public Tertiary retreats, have been introduced. On three successive days a sermon is preached in the morning and in the evening, or at least in the evening. During the day the members are to practice recollection and devote as much time to prayer as their condition allows. Special opportunities for confession are offered." From: Handbook of the Third Order Secular of St. Francis of Assisi, p. 275.

As a simple Franciscan Tertiary retreat, most of the time in the Tridua is dedicated for individual prayer, recollection, spiritual reading and meditation. The object of the Tridua "is not only spiritual renewal in general but renewal in the spirit of St. Francis" Handbook of the Third Order Secular of St. Francis of Assisi, p. 276. Group activities are few and optional, and participation at these is left for the participant to discern. They are provided as an aid to keep your focus on God. The main talks for reflection will be provided by Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM. Attendees can stay at their homes or at facilities provided. Participants can attend one, two or the three days of the Tridua, as personal responsibilities allow.

- Daily Mass
- Eucharistic Adoration
- Confession
- Spiritual Direction
- Ouiet areas for prayer and spiritual reading
- Station of the Cross for individual meditation
- Common areas for fellowship
- Simple meals
