# Something to Consider

**The 12 Promises of the Sacred Heart of Jesus** by Mary Thierfelder (*Reprinted from The Catholic Company website*)



In the Catholic Church, the month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This great feast in the Church is always celebrated on the octave day of Corpus Christi, the feast which celebrates the Body and Blood of Christ. Corpus Christi falls on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday (which itself falls on the Sunday after Pentecost), which means the feast of the Sacred Heart falls 19 days after Pentecost Sunday. The following day is the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, so these two devotions to the hearts of Jesus and Mary are side-by-side on the

liturgical calendar.

Devotion to Jesus' Sacred Heart is perhaps the most popular in the Church today, and it had its beginning in 17th century France. In 1672, Christ appeared to a French Visitation nun, St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. Over a series of visits, Our Lord revealed to St. Margaret Mary the importance of devotion to His Sacred Heart. He asked that His heart, wounded on the cross and continually wounded by ingratitude of men for his sacrifice for them, be venerated and adored as an embodiment of His Divine Mercy and love.

Jesus especially asked that all people go to Confession and receive Holy Communion often, especially on the First Friday of each month, and that reparation be made for sins committed against His Sacred Heart and the Holy Eucharist. He also requested that the Church observe a feast day specifically for the purpose of this reparation. In 1856, the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart was officially added to the liturgical calendar.

You can have a devotion to the Sacred Heart by doing as Our Lord asked, by receiving Holy Communion frequently (especially on the first Friday of each month), monthly Confession, veneration of an image of His Sacred Heart, and prayers and sacrifices offered out of love for Him and for the conversion of sinners.

Jesus also gave us, through St. Margaret Mary, special promises for those who keep a loving devotion to the attribute of His infinite love for mankind as represented in His Most Sacred Heart. 

Be sure to always remain on the sidewalk. If you cannot fulfill your commitment, find a substitute. \*NEVER\* go alone to the clinic – pray from home if your partner will be absent and you cannot find a substitute.

If you are planning to attend, we kindly ask that you fill out the registration form (link available via the Mat Posts or by requesting a printed copy to Susan Kramer, TOF) as soon as possible, as this will help us in planning for the retreat according to the number of attendees. The retreat will start at 4:30 pm on Friday and will end after lunch on Sunday. The registration form directs you to indicate which days you will be attending so the committee can plan accordingly.

Our Constitutions (Art 66) strongly recommends an annual retreat of Franciscan nature. Basil Gummermann, OFM Cap, in his <u>Handbook of The Third Order Secular of St. Francis of Assisi</u>, writes, "By spending several days in holy silence, prayer, meditation, self-examination, and pious planning the soul is enlightened, cleansed, sanctified and prepared for the battles of life... Tertiaries who take the pursuit of perfection seriously avail themselves of the opportunity of making a retreat every year" (p. 274-275).

# Consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus – by Pepe Ventosa, TOF



The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus falls this year on June 7, 2024.

In its Constitution, our Order, which was consecrated to the Sacred Heart by the Ministers General during the Pontificate of Pope Pius IX, makes reference to this devotion in two articles.

Article 68 asks each fraternity to renew the consecration of the Order to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in the month of January or June. Our fraternity will renew this consecration at our June Gathering. The prayer can be found on our website under the "Exercises of Religion" in the menu bar.

Article 72, which deals with the tertiary's family life, strongly recommends consecration of the family to the Sacred Heart and its annual renewal.

# Ongoing Formation for the June Gathering - by Debbie Ventosa, TOF

Kenny Green TOF will be sharing with us Article 58. "They shall sow deep reverence for God's churches, whether these are large and richly furnished, or small and poor, and shall make visits to them readily, whenever an opportunity occurs....."

Please take some time to familiarize yourself with the beauty of this entire article and reflect on how we may be able to draw closer to the Lord by our participation in the Holy Eucharist.

### **Eucharistic Adoration and Daily Prayer**

Council asks those of us who participate in Eucharistic Adoration – and the rest of our fraternity - to remember the following intentions every day when you pray:

- 1. The spiritual protection of our fraternity and of all our members.
- 2. Those in our fraternity who are sick, and their families.
- 3. **Pope Francis** and his intentions.
- 4. Our bishops and their intentions: **Bishop David Bonnar** of the Diocese of Youngstown, **Bishop Robert Pipta** of the Eparchy of Parma, **Bishop Earl Fernandes** of the Diocese of Columbus, and **Bishop Edward Malesic**, **JCL** of the Diocese of Cleveland.
- 5. The Friars of the Immaculate Conception Province of the OFM, particularly **Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM**, **Fr. Dennis Arambasick, OFM**, and **Fr. Robert Campagna, OFM**, who is the Provincial Minister.
- 6. Our beloved, hard-working pastors and parish priests, and our parishes, including Fr. Miron Kerul'-Kmec of St. Nicholas Byzantine Parish (Eparchy of Parma), who hosts our fraternity every month. We also pray for Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF, an Isolated Tertiary who is the pastor of St. George Byzantine Parish in Olympia, Washington and St. Irene Byzantine Parish in Portland, Oregon, as well as being a professor at SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary and contributor to "Catholic Answers" on EWTN radio. And Fr. Ryan Furlong, TOF, who is pastor of St. Thomas the Apostle Parish in Vienna, St. William Parish in Champion, and St. Robert Bellarmine Parish in Cortland (Diocese of Youngstown) and who is a member of the St. Padre Pio Fraternity.

- 7. **Fr. Gastor Temu Bahati** of the Diocese of Moshi who is serving on the staff of his bishop, whom we have spiritually supported for several years.
- 8. Frater Francis Tumaini of the Diocese of Moshi, who is the Moshi seminarian we have adopted.
- 9. All the seminarians of St. Mary Seminary and Borromeo Seminary in Cleveland, which serves the Youngstown and Cleveland Dioceses, as well as the seminarians of SS. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Seminary, which serves the Eparchy of Parma. Our fraternity has spiritually adopted Arthur Bodenschatz, (St. Paul in North Canton) and William Martzaklis (St. Paul in North Canton) from the Diocese of Youngstown, Joseph Rohan, (St. Joseph Parish in Cuyahoga Falls), Alex Krukemeyer, (Our Lady of Victory Parish in Tallmadge), John Paul Antalek (St. Mary Parish in Akron), all from the Diocese of Cleveland, and Andrew Turpin (University of Akron Newman Center, St. Bernard). These men, and Frater Francis of the Moshi Seminary, are the future leaders and servants of our Church.
- 10. Please add prayers for the safety and protection of our Ukrainian brothers and sisters, and for the conversion of Russia as Pope Francis has done in his Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Also, for the spiritual and physical protection of Catholic priests, religious, and lay people everywhere, particularly in Nigeria, Peru, Nicaragua, the Middle East, the Far East, and other countries where our Faith is being attacked.
- 11. For the **protection of all life**, born and unborn, womb to tomb.
- 12. For the blessing of an increase in priestly and religious vocations including the Third Order Franciscans, and for an increase of faithful Catholic marriages and families.

- Virgil Daniel, TOF proclaimed the Gospel of Pentecost Sunday for Lectio Divina, which focused on "the Spirit of Truth".
   We discussed what words and phrases touched us most and how we can apply the wisdom of the Scripture reading to our daily lives. And then we prayed together with those at our table.
- Roberto Meza, TOF led us in Grace before our lunch and social time.
- Our delicious meal was prepared by Mary Dye, TOF; Bob Burtscher, TOF; and Chris and LeeAnn Devore, TOF.
- We were reminded to be sure to get our reservations in for the Franciscan Tridua, which will be held at the Shrine of Our Lady, Comforter of the Afflicted in Youngstown. (Details below this article.)
- After the meal, Roberto Meza, TOF led us in the prayer after the meal.
- Ongoing Formation was taught by Mike Butts, TOF. Mike discussed and explained Article 57 of the Rule.
  - Which exercise should Third Order Franciscans hold first in their vocations?
    - Daily Mass or Spiritual Communion.
  - Holy Mass is a visible sacrifice.
    - Adoration
    - Thanksgiving to God
    - Atonement and Reparation
    - Petitions to God
    - Interior Participation
  - Praying the Rosary before or after Mass is a devout practice, but our focus during Mass should be on Mass, as are other devotions. Our full attention and participation should be on the Mass.

- o Holy Communion
  - Try to attend Mass daily
  - Try to always be free from mortal sin
  - Be sure to receive Communion in a State of Grace
  - The best preparation for Communion:
    - An Act of Faith, Hope, and Love
    - Confession
- Fr. Vit's Formation:
  - o "The world will hate you, but the world hated Me first." Jesus will \*always\* win in the end.
  - o Jesus entrusted His Body and Blood, teaching and Sacraments to His disciples.
  - o Corruption comes when His words and teachings are distorted or "modernized".
  - The Last Supper is a promise.
  - The Resurrection is an Act of God which changes everything.
  - o Make reparation for those in need of prayer. Pray for one's spouses.
  - o "There is nothing colder than a Christian who does not seek to save others." (St. John Chrystosom)
  - Fr. Vit gave us his blessing at the end of his teaching.
- Evangelization Committee: Roberto Meza, TOF said the Committee will be a function of all three fraternities in our area (Ss. Francis & Clare, St. Padre Pio, and Our Lady of America), consisting of perhaps eight members. It will work to share the Third Order Franciscan way of life with others. Please see Matt Poletti, TOF if you are interested in being part of this.
- <u>Formation Report</u>: Debbie Ventosa, TOF reported that Kenny Green, TOF will lead Ongoing Formation in June on Reverence for God's Churches. The Formation teams continue to work with the Postulants and Novices. All groups are progressing and coming along with their studies well.
- Virgil Daniel, TOF seconded Debbie's report. The students continue to study the Rule. He also stated he has received no concerns about the By-Laws, only positive, grateful feedback for the work of the Council. After the Fraternity Council approves of the By-Laws, it will then go forward to Fr. Vit for his approval.
- <u>Infirmarian Report</u>: We were delighted to welcome Elizabeth Francis, TOF at the Gathering and to see her beautiful face! Jennifer Kerns, TOF is feeling under the weather and thought it best to stay home. Betty DeMarco, TOF is mourning a close relative who died, and has asked for our prayers. Denise Williams, TOF had an injury to her head, which put her in the ICU.
- <u>Little Portion</u>: Mary Dye, TOF prepared the Little Portion, and Kenny Green, TOF will deliver it.
- Intercessory Prayer: Roberto Meza, TOF led us in prayer for the various intentions we keep close to our hearts, including the intentions of Pope Francis, our local bishops (Bishop Bonnar of Youngstown, Bishop Fernandes of Columbus, Bishop Pipta of the Eparchy of Parma, and Bishop Malesic of Cleveland), and our parish priests, including Fr. Miron Kerul-Kmec of St. Nicholas Parish (our kind host), Fr. Ryan Furlong, TOF of the St. Padre Pio Fraternity, and Fr. Daniel Dozier, TOF, an Isolated Tertiary. # Franciscan Tertiaries' Tridua 2024 – by Pepe Ventosa, TOF

TRIDUA

Franciscan Tertiaries - OFM Province of the Immaculate Conception



#### What is a Tridua?

"As it is impossible for a great number of Tertiaries to be several days away from home or work, tridua, also known as public Tertiary retreats, have been introduced. On three successive days a sermon is preached in the morning and in the evening, or at least in the evening. During the day the members are to practice recollection and devote as much time to prayer as their condition allows. Special opportunities for confession are offered." From: Handbook of the Third Order Secular of St. Francis of Assisi, p. 275.

As a simple Franciscan Tertiary retreat, most of the time in the Tridua is dedicated for individual prayer, recollection, spiritual reading and meditation. The object of the Tridua "is not only spiritual renewal in general but renewal in the spirit of St. Francis" Handbook of the Third Order Secular of St. Francis of Assisi, p. 276. Group activities are few and optional, and participation at these is left for the participant to discern. They are provided as an aid to keep your focus on God. The main talks for reflection will be provided by Fr. Vit Fiala, OFM. Attendees can stay at their homes or at facilities provided. Participants can attend one, two or the three days of the Tridua, as personal responsibilities allow.

### 12 Promises of the Sacred Heart of Jesus:


- 1. I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- 2. I will establish peace in their homes.
- 3. I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
- 4. I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
- 5. I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- 6. Sinners will find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7. Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- 8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- 9. I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored.
- 10. I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- 11. Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart.
- 12. I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.
