Something to Consider (from The Catholic Handbook)

The Franciscan Rosary is a unique and deeply meaningful devotion that honors the joyful mysteries of the Blessed Virgin Mary's life. Rooted in Franciscan spirituality, this 7 decade rosary takes a distinctive approach by focusing on the moments of joy Mary experienced, from the Annunciation to her Assumption.

It consists of 7 decades. The prayer begins with the Sign of the Cross. Announce the Joy before each decade, meditate on it, pray an Our Father and ten Hail Marys, and continues this procedure with each of the seven decades of Hail Marys. After the seventh mystery, two additional Hail Marys are recited to complete 72 Hail Marys, symbolizing the traditional number of years Mary lived. It can be prayed on a regular rosary, but a dedicated seven-decade Franciscan Rosary enhances the devotion.

The Seven Joys of Mary

- 1. The Annunciation
- 2. The Visitation
- 3. The Birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ
- 4. The Adoration of the Magi
- 5. The Finding of the Child Jesus in the Temple
- 6. The Appearance of Christ to Mary after the Resurrection
- 7. The Assumption and Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven

The Seven Sorrows of Mary (Prayed during Lent)

- 1. The prophecy of Simeon
- The flight to Egypt
- 3. The loss of the Child Jesus for 3 days
- 4. Mary meets Jesus carrying the cross.
- 5. The Crucifixion of Jesus
- 6. The body of Jesus is taken down from the cross and placed in the arms of Mary.
- 7. The body of Jesus is placed in the tomb

How to Pray the Crown Rosary

For each of the next seven decades, introduce and meditate on the assigned mystery.

After completing the seventh decade, add two additional Hail Marys to reach a total of 72 Hail Marys, representing the number of years the Blessed Virgin is traditionally believed to have lived on earth.

While it is optional, you may include the Glory Be and the Fatima Prayer between decades. However, these prayers are not required for the Franciscan Crown Rosary. It is encouraged that all members of the Order, both secular and religious, recite the Franciscan Rosary at least every Saturday, a day specially dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary.





Lord, it is Good for Us to be Together!

- 1. Vice Minister Jim Miller, TOF, greeted us and led the Gathering in place of Roberto Meza, TOF, who is out of town. After determining our table assignments in the Hall, we walked in silence to the church for Liturgy of the Hours. Kenny Green, TOF; Denise Williams, TOF; and Bill Marshall, TOF led our prayer.
- 2. Virgil Daniel, TOF proclaimed the Gospel of the day, which was the story of the dishonest steward "The person who is trustworthy in small matters is also trustworthy in great ones."

He grew up as one of five children of devout Catholic parents, who passed their Faith to Alex and his siblings. He first began to discern the priesthood at his Confirmation, when his Sponsor suggested it would be wonderful for a priest to have a nice parish like Alex's, whose home parish is Our Lady of Victory in Tallmadge. Alex kept thinking about what it would be to live the life of a priest. After he graduated from high school, he decided to enter the seminary and is now in his 7th year of formation and study. 


- 5. Alex then led us in Grace before our lunch.

 - a. **Family** There are no limits to who we bring to God, including via marriage.
 - i. We meet Jesus and influence society for the better in a good and faithful marriage.
 - ii. Sacrifice, faith, hope, and charity are virtues necessary for a strong Catholic family.
 - b. **Prudence, Justice, Fortitude and Temperance** are cardinal virtues that maintain strength in the family. They keep us balanced and close to God.
 - c. **Detachment** leads to surrender and the enjoyment of the good things of life without being devastated if we lose those things.
 - d. <u>Imitation of Jesus</u> comes in part from Marian devotion, remembering what would Jesus do. To Jesus through Mary,
 - e. **Prayer** is necessary for a rich spiritual life. There are four kinds of prayer:
 - i. Petition
 - ii. Adoration
 - iii. Thanksgiving
 - iv. **Praise**
 - f. **Self-knowledge** We cannot advance in spiritual progress without knowing ourselves.
 - g. Fraternity Treating others with respect, humility, and love.
 - h. **Sacrifice** can be painful or pain-free.
 - i. Simplicity opens us up to God.
- 12. **Formation Report** Rose Akins, TOF reported the Novices are rapidly approaching Profession Day. Fifteen Inquirers showed up for the recent Come and See in August. Professed members are always welcome to attend classes and prayers are even more welcome!
